**D.C. Cameras Complete Picture
For Washington Metro Area Commuters and First Responders**

Washington, D.C.—Roadway video cameras in the nation's capital go online today, joining a web-based, multi-jurisdictional system designed to give motorists and first responders across the region live action pictures of traffic flow and road conditions. The District Department of Transportation and TrafficLand, Inc., a private, Fairfax, VA-based company, announced the expansion of this innovative new service, making Washington, D.C. the first large, multi-jurisdictional metropolitan area served by a streaming video traffic and public safety service.

The system utilizes an in-place infrastructure of over 240 roadside closed circuit video cameras in Washington, D.C., Northern Virginia and suburban Maryland. The TrafficLand public website, www.trafficland.com, integrates 100 Northern Virginia Department of Transportation Cameras feeds, 68 Montgomery County Department of Public Works traffic cameras, 24 Maryland State Highway cameras and 52 District of Columbia Department of Transportation camera feeds into a single traffic viewing network.

"The most important city in the world has just added an important new high tech capability for intelligent commuting and better public safety," said TrafficLand President Larry Nelson. "TrafficLand service will help motorists steer around the traffic bottlenecks in the area and give first responders the immediate visual information they need to respond most effectively to roadway situations and emergency events as they happen."

The TrafficLand website provides Internet users with an interactive traffic map of the Washington metropolitan area. Traffic images are organized into clusters (called catalogs), creating an easy way to overview and understand many different locations at once. Catalogs are still images, providing users with a view of up to 12 cameras at once, refreshed once every few seconds. Catalogs are configurable for quick access to camera locations of most interest to individual users. Users can gain a more "fluid" understanding of traffic conditions by clicking on a catalog image and launching a video stream that shows traffic flow at specific intersections.

Washington, D.C. camera locations, now accessible via the web, are identified in the attachment to this release.
